Hymns Ancient & Modern and Revived

In the early days of Christianity, the hymns used in liturgy were unlike the target of the plat we use today, although their style has reappeared since the reforming days of Vatican and the 60s. The earliest hymns were known as *open-form troped songs*, consisting of short as the vers interspersed with assembly refrains. The *call-response* style re-introduced by post-Vation was an attempt to move away from the role of hymn as catechesis to that of ritual music, to assembly into the rites being celebrated.

This unstructured form of hymn gave way in the 4th Century t today the common h orm, that of strophic text verses. St. Ambrose of Milan, the author of this h mmonly regard the father of the modern hymn form and the founder of a new form of hymnody. e open-f ymn, whose verses derive their meaning from the ritual occasion elebra n was a self -contained entity, where the meaning was contained s of the verse mediating newer levels of understanding to the assembly.


