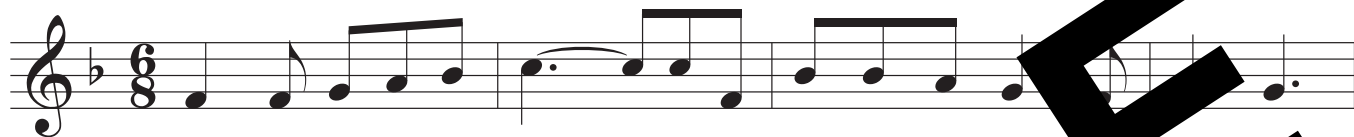
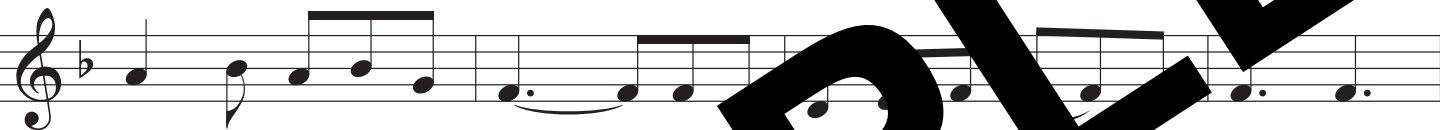


# Let Us Sing To the Lord
