#### Thank you for choosing Cher & Gene Klosner's psalm series!

All of our psalms are presented in SATB, but have been written so that all music ministry groups can use them, from soloist to duo, to contemporary praise teams (SAT), to full choirs.

This particular version is our "Full Song" version, which is verbatim refrain, but paraphrased verses.

You can use this song for Preparation of Gifts or Communion/Meditation any time the readings reflect themes of comfort or help from God. (See Assembly page for an expanded list of themes.)

If you have used songs such as Haugen's "Shepherd Me, O God," Foley's "The Cry of the Poor," or Manion's "I Lift Up My Soul" as your responsorial psalm when those respective psalms are the psalm of the day, then you can use this full song in the same manner when Ps. 121 is the psalm of the day (see the Assembly page for a full list of liturgical uses).

A Full Score (w/piano) version and a lead sheet version of this full song will also be available soon.

Also available soon in our standard "refrain and chant verse" (verbatim verses) version in full score SATB format and Soloist/Small Group format.

#### This PDF contains the following versions:

- Full song SATB + chords (for director, choir, guitar accompanist, piano "chorders" similar to fake books)
- Refrain Assembly (for director, worship aid makers)

#### Format:

- Solo cantor refrain melody\*
- Choir and congregation respond in unison (melody) refrain
- Solo tenor or all tenors cantor verse (if no men available, women sing verses an octave higher than written)
- Choir and congregation refrain with harmonies
- [Continue thru multiple verses and harmonized refrains]
- End with repeat of harmonized refrain (optional)

\*The melody line is the soprano or bass part; note in the harmonized choruses: stems up for sopranos/tenors, stems down for altos/basses. Altos and tenors sing harmonies in the harmonized choruses and they "cross paths" with sopranos and basses, respectively, so follow the correct stems directions; all verses are tenors, even though stems are down, but can be supported by basses if needed. The harmonies at the last line of the verses are intended for altos, but can be supported by sopranos if needed.

This music has a double refrain after the last verse to "close out" the song, so we use the 1st ending (m. 56 - "Yes, our help...") for repeating the refrain, then the tag ending (m. 57) at the very end.

#### Other tips for "Our Help Is from the Lord":

Sing this softly, a la John Denver/Dan Fogelberg, in a style that feels like comfort, since that is what this text is about.

When singing melody, don't let "who made" get drowned out, since it's a low part there.

#### For accompanists:

Chords are above the TB line because tenors will normall have the lead on this song.

We strongly recommend listening to the recordings of this psalm.
