Let us sing to the Lord; he has covered him - self in glo-ry.

Canticle Tone

Mode 5

Exodus 15:1-2, 3-4, 5-6, 17-18. *R/ v. 1b*

1. I will sing to the LORD, for he has gloriously triumphed:
on horse and chariot he has overcome the LORD,
My strength and my courage, the LORD,
and he has been my savior.
He is my God, I praise him;
the God of my father, I extol him. *R/*
2. The LORD is a warrior,
LORD is his name.
[omit C, D]
Pharaoh's chariots and army were hurled into the sea;
the elite of his officers were submerged in the Red Sea. *R/*
The flood waters covered them,
they sank into the depths like stone.
[omit C, D]
Your right hand, O LORD, is magnificent in power,
your right hand, O LORD, has shattered the enemy. *R/*

Note:

Since 1970, the U.S. Lectionary has contained an important error at the end of the Exodus reading preceding this canticle.

According to the Latin original, the reading should end with "Then Moses and the Israelites sang this song to the LORD:" (last line but two), and the Canticle then follows **immediately**, with **no other** lines of scripture and **no** concluding formula ("The word of the Lord") intervening.

the sanctuary, LORD, which your
hands established.
