Mode 5

Psalm 80:9, 12, 13-14, 15-16, 19-20. R/ Isaiah 54:12

1. A vine from Egypt you have brought in, and you drove away the nations and planted it. It put forth its foliage to the sea, and its shoots as far as the River. R/
2. Why have you broken down its walls, so that everyone breaks its fruit, the boar from the forest and the beast of the field feed on it?
3. Once again, O Lord of hosts, look down from heaven and see; care of this vine, and protect what your right hand has planted the son of man whom you yourself made strong. R/
4. Then you will no longer withdraw from you; give us new life, and we will call upon your name. O Lord, God of hosts, restore us; your face shine upon us, then we shall be saved. R/
