All of our psalms are written in comfortable "congregational keys" and presented in SATB(+), but h een written so that all music ministry groups can use them, from soloist to duo, to contemporary praise teams (SAT/SAB), to ful irs For SATB/choir, look up our octavo versions.

The vocals in this Small Group version are presented in treble clef, but can be sung by TB at ave lower. Typ harmony notes can be either Soprano or Tenor, and the lower harmony notes can be Alto o These har cross each other in some of our psalm settings.
